



San Gabriel Reservoir Notice of Construction

WE NEED YOUR HELP

- The sediment that has accumulated in the reservoir is affecting flood control & water storage capacity and must be removed. You will see large earthmoving equipment operating within the reservoir from May through December 2004-2008. The sediment will be loaded with excavators into trucks and hauled up Burro Canyon Road to a site near the Burro Canyon Shooting Park.
- To ensure your safety and that of the Contractor, OHV activity below the fork in the reservoir could be eliminated. However, Barnard Construction would like to have as much area open to you as possible. If we can all abide by the following rules, Barnard and the Forest Service can allow you to recreate in more areas. We need your help.
- It is imperative that you **do not ever enter the construction area**. This area will be marked by “No Trespassing “ signs.
- On **Saturdays, Sundays and holidays** you will be allowed to use a portion of the construction haul road to go around the construction area in order to access some of the reservoir below the construction area. You must stay on the road and travel at a maximum speed of **25 mph** while going around the construction area. Other than that, the entire construction haul road will be off-limits for all OHV’s.
- Due to the large amount of construction activity, on **Monday through Friday** you will not be allowed to go past the “No Trespassing” signs at the north end of the construction zone or use any portion of the haul road.
- There will be security personnel onsite during the weekends to monitor the security of the worksite, equipment; however, we ask for your help in reporting any vandalism or tampering activities to the local Sheriff’s Department or call our office at 626-910-3740. In the unfortunate event damage to the construction site, survey stakes, or equipment occurs, the entire OHV area below the forks may be closed until further notice.
- Unauthorized entry into the construction area will result in a trespassing citation.
- In the event an OHV becomes stuck or broken in an area which affects construction operations, the Sheriff will be notified, and the vehicle may be removed at the vehicle owner’s expense. Again, by entering the OHV area at your own risk, you are accepting complete liability for any injury to yourself or damage to your vehicle that may result, including damages that may occur if your vehicle needs to be removed.
